#### **Choose Rivier to Earn Your Degree**

The Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) in Leadership and Learning is designed to enable students to complete their coursework online in as few as three years, while simultaneously beginning their dissertation in the first year and conducting original research on a topic of local, regional, and national significance. The program is structured to allow students to engage in doctoral study while maintaining their current employment, to develop their career goals, to meet their personal aspirations, and to expand their professional networks.

# **Doctor of Education in Leadership and Learning**

The Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) at Rivier University extends research on what is known about leadership and learning to professionals in the social sciences; applied fields of social service, healthcare, and counseling; and for training and development within organizations, institutions, and systems. In our program, you will:

- Extend the ongoing conversation about leadership and learning to many disciplines and fields of study, to identify what is common in our knowledge, experiences, and practices;
- Engage with professionals from the multiple professions in the discussion of leadership and learning;
- Enable professionals to contribute new theories, models, and constructs of teaching and learning to create enlightened programs and services;
- Conduct research on human growth and development, learning, and the nature of help and support in a variety of disciplines and professions in order to formulate an informed understanding of the nature of change.

## **Course Sequence**

By following the course sequence below, you will be able to complete your Ed.D. in as few as three years. The sequence consists of seven-week, three-credit courses totaling 48 credits. A first-year Orientation includes an introduction to the program and doctoral study.

# **Our Distinguished Faculty**

## **Admissions Requirements**

Applicants must:

- have earned baccalaureate and master's degrees from an accredited college or university;
- have maintained a grade-point average of 3.25 or better in courses at or above the 500 level; and
- provide current resume or curriculum vitae documenting at least three years of relevant professional experience.

## **Application Requirements**

The application deadline for the upcoming academic year is August 1, 2026. A complete application submitted to the Office of Graduate and Professional Studies Admissions includes the following:

- A completed online application, available at www.rivier.edu/apply;
- 2. Official transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate institutions where you have received degrees and/or course credit;
- 3. A written statement of your purpose in seeking doctoral study that reflects in detail upon the following:
  - a. Your professional experience and how that experience relates to your intended doctoral study;
  - b. Your reasons for pursuing doctoral study;
  - c. The research goal(s), problem(s), and/or question(s) you are interested in addressing through doctoral study and research;
  - d. The ways in which doctoral study will enhance your personal and professional career goals and plans;
  - e. Specific examples of presentations, papers, publications, or other scholarship related to your goals for doctoral study; and
- 4. At least three letters of recommendation.
- 5. An interview may be requested by the Admissions Committee.

Our Doctoral cohorts begin each September. Applications are reviewed throughout the year; students are accepted on a rolling admissions basis.

Once your application portfolio is complete, you may be invited to interview with the Doctoral Program Admissions Committee. Normally, notification of acceptance is provided within 14 days of application portfolio completion.
