In 2023, U.S. nursing schools turned away 78,200 qualified applicants from baccalaureate and graduate nursing programs, according to the American Association of Colleges of Nursing. Most nursing schools surveyed pointed to faculty shortages as a reason for not accepting all qualified applicants into baccalaureate programs.

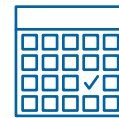

### ADDITIONAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Students may take four courses (12 credits) from a list of specified courses prior to matriculating.
- Students must follow their Program of Studies when registering for courses. If students wish to make a change to their Program of Studies, they must request the change in writing to the Graduate Nursing Education Program Director.
- Students must complete clinical/practicum requirements four months prior to practicum courses.

### BRIDGE OPTIONS

The University offers bridge options for the nurses with an associate degree or diploma preparation (RN-MS) as well as an option for RNs with a bachelor's degree in another field. These programs have additional requirements.
