### Why Study Criminal Justice at Rivier

Rivier's Criminal Justice degree examines the law, causes of crime, and the justice system, and it prepares students to succeed in the field of criminal justice and beyond.

### Build Your Knowledge Base

The program draws upon multiple disciplines, including the law, political science, sociology, and history. So that students may succeed wherever life's journeys take them, courses emphasize skills that are essential for all professionals, such as analytical, critical reasoning, and communication skills.

### Gain Real-World Experience

The curriculum focuses on experiential learning, requiring students to apply what they have learned to real-world situations. All students complete at least one internship with police departments, jails and prisons, prosecutor offices, victim assistance bureaus, adult and juvenile probation/parole, drug courts, and federal law enforcement agencies. This enables students to begin developing a professional network before they graduate. Study abroad opportunities, clubs, and co-curricular events offer learning and leadership activities outside of the classroom.

- Law enforcement at the local, state, and federal levels
- Corrections facilities
- Probation/parole
- Victim services
- Working with at-risk youth and juvenile offenders

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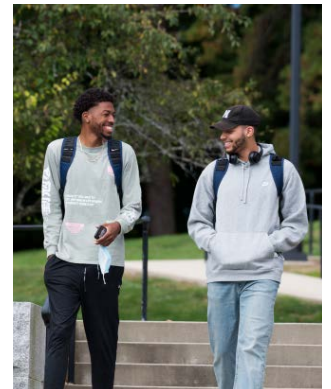
