AG-ACNPs provide a wide spectrum of care for their patients aged 17 and older—from meeting immediate, acute care needs to disease prevention; the top diagnoses treated by AG-ACNPs are hypertension, heart failure, and diabetes.* As a Nurse Practitioner, you'll diagnose and treat your patients' medical problems, as well as act as a researcher, educator, and counselor in service to your patients' care. AG-ACNPs work in the acute care environment and serve in the hospitalist role or specialty areas such as ER, critical care, surgery, or cardiology.

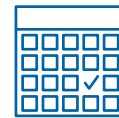

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Students may take four courses (12 credits) from a list of specified courses prior to matriculating.
- Students must follow their Program of Studies when registering for courses. If students wish to make a change to their Programs of Studies, they must request the change in writing to the Graduate Nursing Education Program Director.
- Students must complete clinical/practicum requirements four months prior to practicum courses.

Note: Nursing practicums may be completed in student's geographic location. Program prerequisites include undergraduate statistics (or evidence of completion), Basic Life Support and Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support certifications.
