TRANSFER ARTICULATION PROGRAM

A.S. in Criminal Justice –Corrections Concentration of Mount Wachusett Community College to B.S. in Criminal Justice at Rivier College

Beginning with the 2012-2013 academic year, a graduate of Mount Wachusett Community College, who meets the following requirements and satisfactorily completes the following requirements for admission will be automatically accepted for admission and receive junior-class standing in the Criminal Justice Division at Rivier College for the Bachelor of Science degree program in Criminal Justice:

- Completes the requirements of the Criminal Justice Track (CJCD) program as listed in the Mount Wachusett Community College catalog, and;
- Receives the Associate Degree in Science with a minimum of a C (2.0) grade point average.
- Submits application for transfer to the Admissions Office at Rivier College
- Accompanies application for transfer admission with a \$25 non-refundable fee
- Indicates Transfer Articulation Program (TAP) on transfer application
- Submits a complete official transcript from Mount Wachusett Community College

Students who transfer through the Transfer Articulation Program are generally able to complete their remaining requirements for the baccalaureate degree in two more years of full-time study. Advising material is included with this agreement and early academic advising is strongly recommended.

Entrance Requirements for all students include submission of a Writing Sample, an institutional assessment tool, which is administered to all new students, including students who transfer through the Transfer Articulation Program. Credits earned for ENG101 English Composition I will be accepted for transfer; however, course placement (whether fulfilling the requirement, ENG120 College Composition I, and/or a general elective) will be determined individually upon completion of the Writing Sample and recommendations submitted by department faculty.

This agreement, effective 2012-2013 academic year, will be ongoing. This agreement is subject to catalog and/or program revisions at both institutions; however, this agreement will continue to apply to students who transfer from the Mount Wachusett Community College Criminal Justice Transfer program within one year of the expiration of this agreement.
