## Connect with Your Inner Child



We will have building blocks, modeling clay, coloring pages, and bubbles on hand for some playtime fun! The bubbles are to keep, while supplies last.






## Staff Pick of the Month

"If the radiance of a thousand suns were to burst at once into the sky that would be like the splendor of the Mighty One. I am become Death, the Destroyer of Worlds." – J. Robert Oppenheimer, July 16, 1945, quoting the Bhagavad Gita.

My pick this month is not a book, but the epic Academy Award-winning film <u>Oppenheimer</u>, starring Cillian Murphy in the title role.

Oppenheimer is a biographical film about physicist J. Robert Oppenheimer. The film chronicles his early life as a researcher, follows his path from Harvard and the University of Cambridge, and delves into his leadership of the top-secret Manhattan Project during World War II: a mission to develop the world's first atomic weapon.





We watch Oppenheimer navigate marriage and family life, confer with other brilliant minds of this time, and clash with professional and political figures. Emily Blunt, Jack Quaid, Matt Damon and Robert Downey Jr. are all delightful to watch and give an added air of authenticity to this film. Cillian Murphy does an amazing job of portraying Oppenheimer as a man struggling with mounting pressure, ethical dilemmas, and his sense of responsibility as this enormous project progresses. As a viewer, I truly felt as though I was there at the Trinity test site in Alamogordo and experiencing a true sense of the magnitude of the project at hand.

I am not an avid movie-watcher, and any film over 2½ hours is usually too much for me. However, this one not only held my attention for over 3 hours, but I gladly would have sat there longer to see and learn more about this subject.

Oppenheimer is visually and aurally stunning, the performances are stellar, and you will learn a lot about this era of world history. I highly recommend you check out this DVD for your next movie night at home. (If you want to read the book upon which this movie is based, be sure to check out our copy of <u>American</u> <u>Prometheus: The Triumph and Tragedy of J. Robert Oppenheimer</u>!)
