FEBRUARY RELIGIOUS HOLIDAYS

TU BISHVAT (JUDAISM)

Feb. 2, 2026

The 15th of Shevat on the Jewish calendar—celebrated this year on Monday, Feb. 2, 2026—is the day that marks the beginning of a “new year” for trees. Commonly known as Tu Bishvat, this day marks the season in which the earliest-blooming trees in the Land of Israel emerge from their winter sleep and begin a new fruit-bearing cycle. On this day we remember that “man is a tree of the field” ([Deuteronomy 20:19](#)), and reflect on the lessons we can derive from our botanical analogue.

MAHA SHIVARATRI (HINDUISM)

Feb. 15, 2026

Maha Shivaratri is a festival celebrating Lord Shiva and literally translates as “The Great Night of Shiva.” It celebrates Lord Shiva's divine power, symbolizing the triumph over darkness and ignorance, and marking auspicious events like his wedding to Parvati or the night he performed the cosmic dance (Tandava).

ASH WEDNESDAY (CHRISTIANITY)

Feb. 18, 2026

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, the 40-day season leading up to Easter. On Ash Wednesday, Christians typically fast, abstain from eating meat, and receive ashes in the sign of the cross on their forehead. The ash symbolizes the repentance of sins and our mortality. The cross serves as a reminder of Jesus' death on the cross in atonement for our sins.

LENT (CHRISTIANITY)

Feb. 18 - April 2, 2026



Lent is one of five seasons in the Catholic Church (the others are Easter, Ordinary Time, Advent, and Christmas). It begins with Ash Wednesday and concludes on Holy Thursday (the Thursday before Easter Sunday). In total, it lasts 40 days, not counting Sundays. The forty-day length of Lent is rooted in the biblical usage of the number forty, which typically represents a time of testing, trial, penance, purification, and renewal. In the New Testament, forty days is the length of Jesus' time of trial in the desert in preparation for his public ministry, proclaiming the Gospel. During Lent, the focus is on recommitting to and strengthening one's faith through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Many people choose to give something up (fasting) and add something (maybe a new prayer practice and/or actively doing good in their community).

RAMADAN (ISLAM)

February 17 - March 19, 2026

Ramadan is the ninth month in the Islamic calendar and is one of the most sacred times of the year for Muslims. Since the Islamic calendar follows the lunar cycle, it is sometimes difficult to calculate exactly when Ramadan begins. In 2026, it is likely to start at sun-down on February 17th. The month of Ramadan is observed through fasting, worship, service, communal gathering, and spiritual development.
