Rivier University offers elementary education programs for prospective teachers. In this program, you'll learn effective teaching strategies and strengthen your mastery of academic content working with professors who are recognized regionally and nationally as experts in their fields. You'll be prepared to work effectively with students, parents, and your colleagues to help children get the best education possible and reach their full potential.

Upon completion of this program, you will be eligible for licensure in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. Territories, the Department of Defense Schools, Alberta, British Columbia, and Ontario per the NASDTEC Interstate Agreement.

Licensure

Students seeking teacher licensure must apply for licensure after successfully completing the internship, the program competencies, and other program requirements. New Hampshire teacher licensure is not automatic with the completion of the internship.

Rivier's M.Ed. programs provide real-world assignments and hands-on experience in the field to help you put theory into practice and develop your skills. Courses are offered in 7-week and 14-week terms for added flexibility to accommodate your busy schedules and learning preferences.



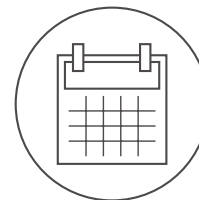
