Elizabeth Murphy says that her experience at Rivier has given her a lot of confidence in her decision to pursue a degree in mental health counseling. “I know that I’ve learned a lot while I’ve been here—Dr. Langelier is one of the best advisors I’ve encountered in my education,” she says. Elizabeth appreciates that Rivier’s programs offer real-world opportunities to learn. As an assignment for a cultural diversity class, she interviewed homeless teens in Manchester. “I didn’t know there was a hierarchy in homelessness,” she says. Many of the teens she spoke with had been abused or neglected; they also had mental health issues. “They don’t know about child and family services, places that will give you food and shelter,” she says. “I explained to them that this was the what-if: you can go do something about your situation, here are resources available for you.” She calls the experience “amazing” and says it solidified her desire to work with teens.
