educational settings.



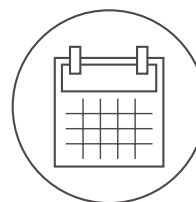

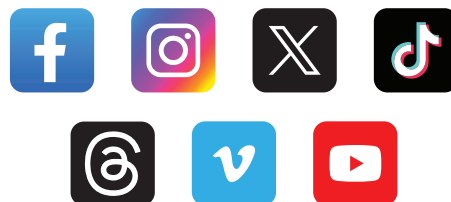
