There is a critical need for nursing educators in the United States. As an experienced clinician and instructor, you can play a role in ensuring the quality of nursing education and future patient care.

In 2020, U.S. nursing schools turned away 80,407 qualified applicants from baccalaureate and graduate nursing programs. Most nursing schools surveyed pointed to faculty shortages as a reason for not accepting all qualified applicants into baccalaureate programs.

Shifts in treatment settings, escalations in substance use disorders and mental illness diagnoses, and the aging baby boomer generation are driving changes in the role of nurses. These shifts require nurse educators that are equipped to expand primary care training for nursing students.
