Build Your Knowledge Base

Rivier's Political Science program focuses on the political, historical, and economic power structures that form the framework of contemporary life. The curriculum develops strong critical thinking, data analysis, and ethical reasoning skills and provides you with knowledge and comparative perspectives on current and past political events in the U.S. and around the world.

Gain Real-World Experience

The program goes beyond the theory and ideology with experiential learning opportunities, having you apply what you've learned to real-world situations. As a Political Science major, you'll complete at least one career-focused internship; students have interned for political campaigns, non-profit organizations, and advocacy groups. Study abroad trips, clubs, and co-curricular events offer learning and leadership activities outside of the classroom including Rivier's Model United Nations team, which researches and discusses various countries and political issues in preparation for an annual conference held at Harvard University.
