Pursue specialty certifications to add to your skill set.

Post-master's certificate programs build your clinical skills and knowledge and provide the opportunity for you to take on new challenges and redefine your career path.

Rivier offers four post-master's nursing certificates—Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP), Adult Gerontology – Acute Care Nurse Practitioner (AG-ACNP), Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP), and Nursing Education (NE)—to RNs that have already earned an MSN degree. Completion of these certificates prepares graduates to sit for national board certification exams.

Pursue a New Professional Direction

Post-master's certificates allow you to alter your career path by building on it. The Family Nurse Practitioner Certificate prepares you to care for patients from infancy through adulthood, providing treatment for illnesses, as well as preventative and health education services. The Adult Gerontology - Acute Care Nurse Practitioner certificate allows you to treat adults 17 and older addressing acute care diagnosis and treatment. The Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner Certificate qualifies graduates to assess, diagnose, and treat individuals' and groups' mental health needs. Completing the Nursing Education Certificate will enable you to share your knowledge and experience with the next generation of nurses.
